One Gardener's Journey won a gold medal for designer Carolyn Priest, founder of The Garden Rejuvenator. Drifts of planting created a meadow-like effect, punctuated by a winding swathe of colour. The concept behind the design was the journey of learning and exploration you embark upon when creating a new garden.



The silver medal and the HMA award for Best Planting Design went to Karen Sutherland of Edible Eden Design for An Urban Food Forest. Designed to be a haven away from the bustle of city life, it showed how productive gardens can be created in the smallest of outdoor spaces.
